## California State University ADT Implementation Fall 2020

The historic partnership between the California Community Colleges and the California State University (CSU) under the Associate Degree for Transfer program guarantees ADT earners admission to the CSU with junior standing after having completed the required 60 units at a community college. Once enrolled at the CSU, students are not required to take more than the 60 necessary units of upper-division coursework to graduate. To fulfill the real promise of the Associate Degree for Transfer program, CSUs must ensure there is a clear pathway for students to transfer under the same program of study as their ADT. Without this, students may be asked to duplicate work they successfully completed at their community college, leading them to spend more time and money on their bachelor's degree.

# **2021 Equity Champions and Distinctions**

California Community College campuses where Latinx or Black students are performing better than average have a negative Percentage Point Gap (PPG) and will receive Equity Distinctions. PPGs were determined by accounting for the difference between a campus' overall ADT rate and their equivalent rates for Black and Latinx students. A positive PPG entails that the campus' overall rate is higher than their rate for the relevant subgroup of Latinx or Black students, while conversely, a negative PPG indicates that the subgroup's rate is higher than the overall rate. Colleges where the relevant subgroup of Latinx or Black students is performing above the collegewide average (aka a negative PPG) will receive Equity Distinctions.

For California State University campuses, PPGs were determined by accounting for the difference between a school's overall enrollment rate of students with ADTs on a guaranteed path to earning a Bachelor's degree and their equivalent rates for Latinx and Black students. A positive PPG entails that the campus' overall rate is higher than their rate for the relevant subgroup of Latinx or Black students, while conversely, a negative PPG indicates that the subgroup's rate is higher than the overall rate. Campuses where the relevant subgroup is performing above the collegewide average (aka a negative PPG) will receive Equity Distinctions.
