As the Campaign for College Opportunity's first Senior Vice President of Programs and Strategy, she serves as a member of the Campaign's executive team leading strategic efforts to advance the Campaign's vision of ensuring all Californians can attend, afford, and complete a college education. In this role, she oversees and drives alignment of strategic priorities across the organization ensuring policy impact, actionable research, and effective advocacy strategies. She brings more than a decade of experience in higher education state policy and advocacy to the role and a deep commitment to the Campaign's mission with close to ten years in various leadership roles leading the organization's state policy agenda.
