Running from **November 2024 to June 2025**, SLI will bring together a cohort of 20 passionate college students from across California, providing them with the skills and tools needed to become effective advocates for higher education policy and to lead initiatives that impact student experiences.

Our mission is to empower student voices, ensuring they play a crucial role in shaping policies that reflect their needs and experiences. Ideal Candidate

- A willingness to collaborate with others
- A desire to learn and grow their leadership skills
- The ability to effectively engage with diverse groups

No prior knowledge of policy or California legislation is required, as participants will receive support in building their skills throughout the program.

Goals of the SLI Program

- **Engage and Expand Skills:** Foster the development of a diverse group of student advocates in California's higher education landscape.
- **Empower Actionable Leaders**: Cultivate a cohort of student leaders who are prepared to engage with policy priorities through various means, such as drafting communications, sharing personal narratives in relevant forums, and engaging in discussions with institutional leaders and policymakers.

How to Apply

If you're ready to take the next step in your leadership journey and make a meaningful impact in higher education, we encourage you to apply. Here's what you need to know:

Application Components

• Complete the online application, including thoughtful responses to the questions provided.

Application Criteria

- Applicants must be students at a California UC, CSU, or CCC.
- There are no specific GPA requirements, and prior leadership experience is not mandatory.
- We prefer undergraduates in their 1st or 2nd year; typically, graduate students are not accepted.

Selection Process



- If selected, candidates will be available for interviews during the week of October 21st.
- The new cohort will be announced on Monday, October 28th.
- Students must be available for all session dates and should be prepared to attend the first meeting in person in Los Angeles.

Commitment Expectations

- Participants are expected to attend all five sessions. Missing more than one session will result in forfeiture of the \$1,000 stipend.
- Session locations will be announced, with the first session taking place at the Campaign for College Opportunity offices.

Costs and Funding

• There is no cost to attend the sessions; all expenses will be covered by the Campaign for College Opportunity, including travel and hotel accommodations if necessary.

Support and Resources

• Participants will receive mentorship and training materials throughout the program to support their development.
