## WORST IN THE NATION

California has the **highest number of working low-income families** in the US.

- Nearly half are without a high school diploma or GED.
- 60% have no postsecondary education.

More than 3.2 million children, or **40 percent** of all children under the age of 18 in California, are in working low-income families.
